Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely State Model Institute of Ayurveda Sciences, Kolavada, Gandhinagar- 382028, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0373) inspection was conducted on 03.04.2025 and 04.04.2025 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the yearly permission with intake capacity 60 (75 seats including EWS) seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st renewal of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 60 seats to 100 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report and as per the Visitor Observation following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

1) Teaching staffs:-

3) Accordingly, the assessment report was placed in the 122nd Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 14.05.2025, Board discussed and decided to ask the college for Clarification regarding the aforementioned defects/ shortcoming found during the assessment as per Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 and the same was communicated to you vide letter of even no. dated 20.05.2025. In response of the same you have submitted the clarification vide letter ref. no. SMAC/K.G/361/2025 dated 23.05.2025.

4) Accordingly, the submitted clarification and the assessment report was once again carefully examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provision under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-

5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined in terms concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was once again placed in the 129th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 27.06.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of yearly permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations for 60 (75 seats including EWS) seats in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st renewal of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 60 seats to 100 seats, due to shortcoming in hospital & non-teaching staff. However, Board decided to issue permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in the aforementioned UG Course accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26.

(i) <u>For Deficiency in Non-Teaching staff (excluding Group D staff) seat reduction in intake capacity shall be</u> <u>considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-</u>

For deficiency of the Laboratory Technician post in the Rog Nidan and Vikriti Vigyan Department, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat. As there is shortcoming of 01 Laboratory Technician against the minimum requirement of 01 as per MESAR Ayurveda UG 2024. Therefore, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat.

(ii) For Deficiency in Hospital staff (excluding group D staff) seat reduction in intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake capacity as under:-

For non-availability of every **03 Staff Nurses** Seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat. As only 04 Staff Nurses are available against the minimum requirement of 10, therefore seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 02 seats.

Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 and as per the MESAR UG Regulation 2024, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of yearly permission with intake capacity of <u>57 seats (71 seats including EWS) instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st renewal of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from 57 seats to 97 seats under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.</u>

"DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to State Model Institute of Ayurveda Sciences, Kolavada, Gandhinagar- 382028, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0373) with intake capacity of <u>57 seats</u> (71 seats including EWS) instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and 1st renewal of Permission for increase in intake capacity in existing UG (BAMS) Course from <u>57 seats to 97 seats</u> under section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-
 - I. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of <u>97</u> seats (111 including EWS) instead of 100 seats (115 seats including EWS) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college

shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) The aforementioned shortcomings as following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
 - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda, Regulations, 2024,
 - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - v) The remaining shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 4, shall be fulfilled.
- 11) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
